



Exhibit Specifications for “A Few Good Women: Women in the Military During the Second World War”

- 11 text panels, measuring 24" H x 36" W
- 13 framed panels of photos and captions covering related topics, such as women working in wartime factories, measuring 29" H x 21" W
- 8 photo panels highlighting individual Michigan women, measuring 14" H x 11" W
- 7 laminated recruitment posters of various sizes
- 3 mini-posters, measuring roughly 8.5" H x 6.5" W
- 1 sponsor panel, measuring 24" H x 18" W

Notes:

1) The exhibit, which occupies 90 linear feet of space, may be rented for a fee of \$125 per week for a minimum of four weeks.

2) The exhibit is contained in 2 large (39.5" x 26.5" x 4.5") wooden crates, 2 medium (32.5" x 23.5" x 6.25") wooden crates, and small cardboard open-top bin (holds the 8 photo panels of individual MI women). Renter must arrange for or pay for shipping both ways.

3) All text and photo panels can be hung by Velcro on a fabric surface or by nail on plastered walls. (The panels are equipped with plastic hanging tabs.)

4) The exhibit must be picked up from and delivered back to the Michigan Women's Historical Center by minivan, station wagon, or covered pick-up truck at the renter's cost.
